I just tested it again and it did not work, and in fact it prevented results I would have expected to see. I suggest running a side by side comparison of searches with the plus versus quotation marks in order to see the difference.

From Lisa: Without the benefit of seeing the specific situation, I would recommend focusing your search on the record collection you need rather than the names of individual ancestors. I go into detail on this strategy in the book.
